

This will ensure that people with dementia feel understood, valued and able to contribute to their community.

#### Why are Dementia Friendly Communities important?

Too many people affected by dementia feel society fails to understand the condition they live with, its impact or how to interact with them and withdraw from their community as the the condition progresses.

In fact, over a third of people with dementia told the Alzheimer's Society that they have felt lonely recently. More than a quarter of carers said they felt 'cut off from society' too. People affected by dementia still have an incredible amount to offer to their community and can play an active and valuable role after diagnosis.

### Who can help make their community dementia friendly?

We all have a part to play in creating Dementia Friendly Communities. People affected by dementia have the most important role in any Dementia Friendly Community. By sharing their experiences, they ensure that communities keep the needs of people affected by dementia at the heart of everything they do.
